



Stepping Out of the Echo Chamber: Utilizing Databases to Teach Critical Thinking and Empathy

The rise and rapid evolution of social media has produced a fragmented and polarized society where many of us, often unwittingly, reside in "echo chambers" where we are surrounded by like-minded views that reinforce our preconceptions and biases. As students coming of age begin to form societal views on their own, it is important for educators to bring them out of their comfort zones and expose them to views and values that challenge their own, helping them to reason objectively and individually by developing key critical thinking skills, as well as encouraging them to try to experience and understand views contrary to their own by nurturing empathy.

In this session we will look into how library databases can help achieve such objectives without imposing the educator's views and maintaining an open ended dialogue between everyone.

A Postsecondary Syllabus for English in Malaysia: Mending a Broken Link

Concerns about English language proficiency among our graduates from public and private higher learning institutions have featured prominently in mainstream discussions over many years now. While most of these discussions have been contextualised in the teaching of English at higher learning institutions, there is also a need to understand the issue through broader discussions reflecting on the journey of Malaysian students from pre-school right up to university. In this presentation, I focus specifically on English language teaching at the postsecondary level, and discuss the importance of a postsecondary syllabus which moves away from an overemphasis on the MUET. I also share my thoughts on how a postsecondary syllabus can better prepare students for the demands of English language communication at higher learning institutions.

Providing Worthwhile Content for Today's Young and Hungry Minds



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Dr. Malachi Edwin Vethamani Emeritus Professor (Malaysia)

Emeritus Professor Dr. Malachi Edwin Vethamani is a poet, writer, editor, critic, bibliographer and academic. He is former Head, School of English and Professor of Modern English Literature at the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences, University of Nottingham Malaysia. His publications include: Coitus Interruptus and Other Stories (2018), two collections of poems, Life Happens (2017) and Complicated Lives (2016). His latest publication is an edited volume of Malaysian poems entitled, Malaysian Millennial Voices (2021). He has also edited two volumes of Malaysian writings which cover a period of over 60 years, Malchin Testament: Malaysian Poems (2018) and Ronggeng-Ronggeng: Malaysian Short Stories (Maya Press, 2020). The Malaysian Publishers Association awarded Malchin Testament: Malaysian Poems the Anugerah Buku Malaysia 2020 for the English Language category. He was bestowed the Special Excellence Award, Alumni Laureate Award 2020, by his alma mater, University of Nottingham and the Vice-Chancellor's Achievement Medal, University of Nottingham in 2019. In 2013, he was given the Asian Education Leadership Award conferred by World Education Congress, Mumbai, India and the Malaysian English Language Teaching Association (MELTA) Special Award. He is a recipient of the Fulbright Scholarship (2000) and the Chevening Award (1993).



Literature and Life-long Enjoyment of Reading

Reading is an essential part of our daily lives. For most people, reading serves only as a means to elicit information from various sources. Reading should go beyond this purpose. Reading should be pleasurable and give hours of enjoyment. Reading literary texts allows for aesthetic reading and this can be experienced at various stages, starting young with unconscious delight to appreciation and critical reading at a later stage. I will highlight how reading literary texts in the language classroom can be the launch pad for developing life-long readers and future creative writers.

The study of literature in the classroom can focus all too often on what the text 'means' in terms of the 'right' answers for exams. 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

Andrew was the founding Principal when ISPKL opened in 2011, during which time he held the position of Chairman of the Association of International Malaysian Schools (AIMS).

Andrew, who was born and raised in the UK, started out his career in engineering before changing his profession into teaching. Developing Pandemic Mental Health Resilience, Our Best Strategy To Weather The Covid-19 Storm

Perhaps the dark cloud of the Covid-19 pandemic, which has been 'imprisoning us all' in our homes over the last year, in whichever corner of the world we live in, does have a silver lining after all !

Mental health, which has always been the stigma laden component of health is beginning to be shown the front seat and increasingly being recognised as THE MOST important determinant of an individual's ability to weather this and every possible storm of life.

The ability to keep our head above the water and survive by maintaining good mental and psychological well-being, is increasingly being shown to be the vital factor in determining good physical health, and helps us cope with the uncertainty of the future. It determines our functioning and helps us build resilience to cope with future stressors.

What is the challenge for those of us who have the brilliant minds, the passion, the expertise and the economic ability to make a difference? How can we alleviate mental suffering and prevent illness, empower the children of today, not just to survive this pandemic but develop the resilience and mental capability to become better leaders of tomorrow?

We need to start by becoming their role models today, and the Covid-19 pandemic is revolutionising the way we live, learn, 'go to school', communicate and indirectly pointing the way. We need to become digital warriors for the sake of our children and teach them how to fight this and other future wars.

As succinctly pointed out by Dr. Daniel Fung, *IACAPAP President, Adjunct Associate Professor, Lee Kong Chian School of Medicine Singapore,* in his IACAPAP President's Message – March 2021 – IACAPAP: Starting a War in 2021 *By: Dr Daniel Fung,*

".... we have a responsibility to build a better world for our children. If all we do is treat mental illnesses in children, we might as well be a car mechanic repairing the vehicles that have broken down. We want to be the engineers that design better cars for the future. Which means we must think of the social determinants of mental illness and the adverse childhood experiences that cause childhood and eventually adult mental illnesses in the first place. We must do better for protecting children and their development in the critical and sensitive periods.

We need to rally together as a community of practitioners to develop mental health interventions for preventing mental illness and promoting resilience that is evidence informed. I dare not say evidence based because it may be hard to get to that standard but we certainly have enough evidence to suggest that so much can be done to reduce abuse, neglect and bullying in environments that children grow up in. We can do this together with other like-minded organisations, not just with psychiatrists. We need to work across disciplines and also across the world. Many lower- and middle-income countries do not have many professionals caring for children so we need to extend our advocacy to those areas as well. In the past, this would be difficult but in today's connected world, it could be done virtually, in an instance.

We are starting a new way of reaching out to the world using the technology that we have before us. This journey started 10 years ago and has gone from strength to strength. I drew that engineering analogy because the child mental health professional of the future is a digital warrior."

Do we dare to take up this challenge from whichever corner of the world we come from to REALLY start to work together as digital warriors and make that much needed difference, that, right now is indeed a matter of life or death?


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Karen Ewing Young CEO (US)




Azlina Kamal Education Specialist, UNICEF Malaysia

Curriculum in Malaysia

The national curriculum, according to the 1996 Education Act, is an educational programme that includes curriculum and co-curriculum activities which encompasses the knowledge, skills, norms, values, cultural elements and beliefs. The aim is to develop a pupil intellectually, spiritually, emotionally and physically as well as to inculcate and develop desirable moral values and to transmit knowledge. I will highlight the curriculum conceptual framework, the standards-based curriculum and assessment, and some challenges in delivery given the current landscape and crisis.

Integrating the Malaysian National Curriculum with the Cambridge International Curriculum: The IHES Approach

Education is a continuous learning process by which people's potentials, abilities, giftedness and talents are nurtured, developed and enhanced. Education in this broad sense is also everything that is learned and acquired in a life time; knowledge, character, moral, skills, habits, interests, attitude, behaviour, personalities, leadership, entrepreneurship, craftsmanship, etc. Education is based on a system of belief using the learning processes of teaching, coaching, training, advisory and consultancy and applying the approaches of instructional (reception of knowledge), investigational (discovery of knowledge) and constructional (immersion of knowledge). The Integrated Holistic Education System (IHES) focuses on five (5) learning outcomes; Immersion of Knowledge, Character Building, Skills and Competency Enhancement, Academic Achievement and Application in Life. Therefore, in order for us to actualize a continuous educational transformation and reforms, we need an education system that is stable with efficacy (effective, strong and solid, impactful, potent and efficient), complete and sustainable, contemporary, comprehensive, integrative, holistic and universal. Otherwise, only transaction processing within education will happen.



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
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
