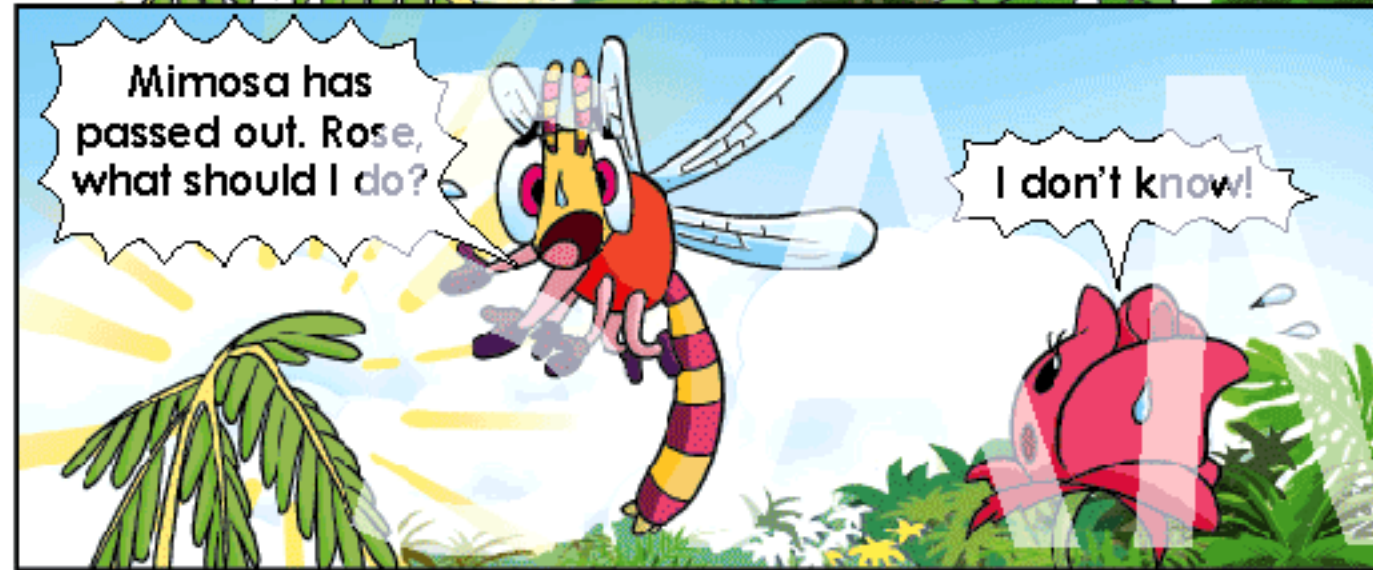

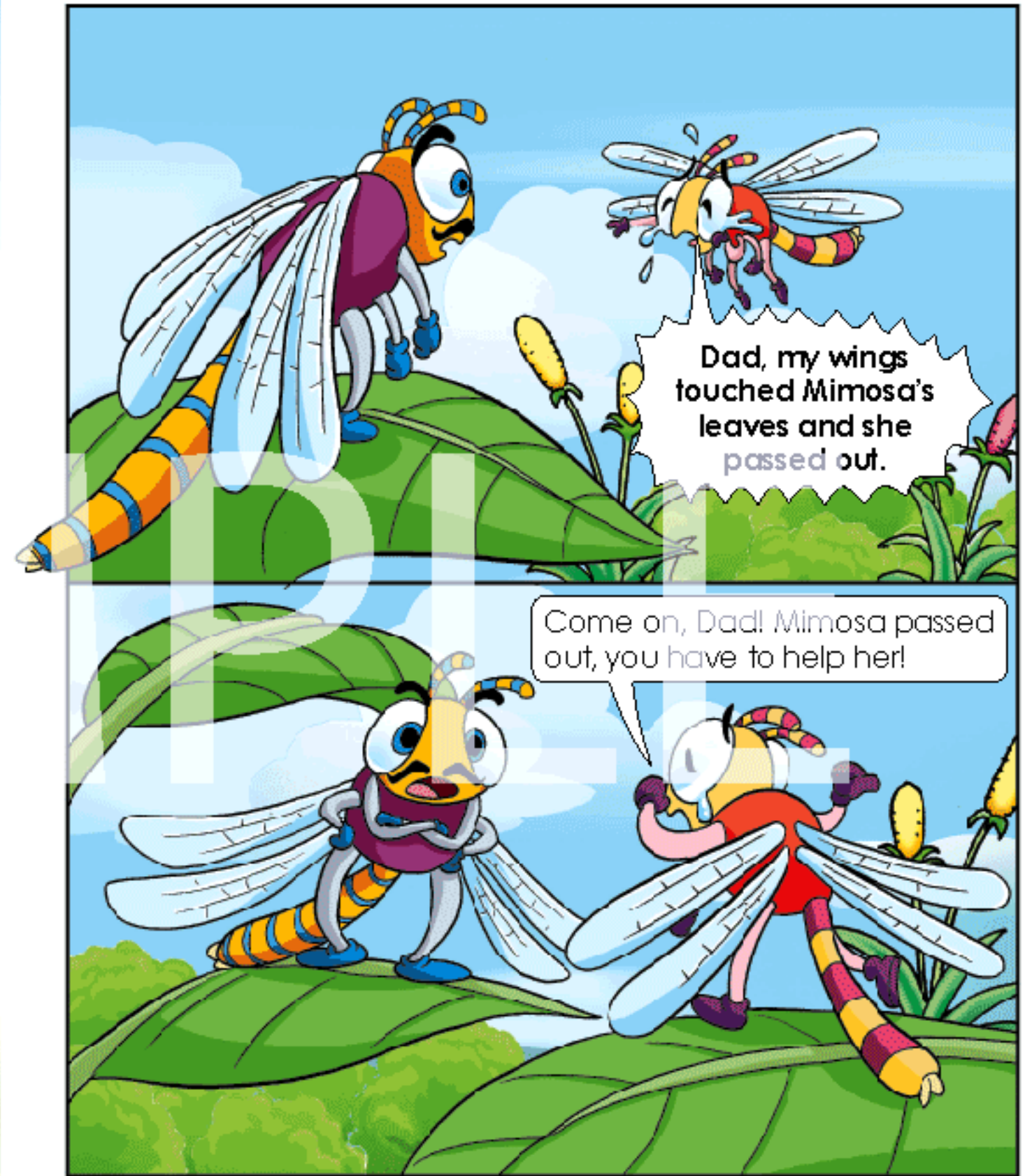

I'm sorry, Mum. From now on, I'll listen to what you say.

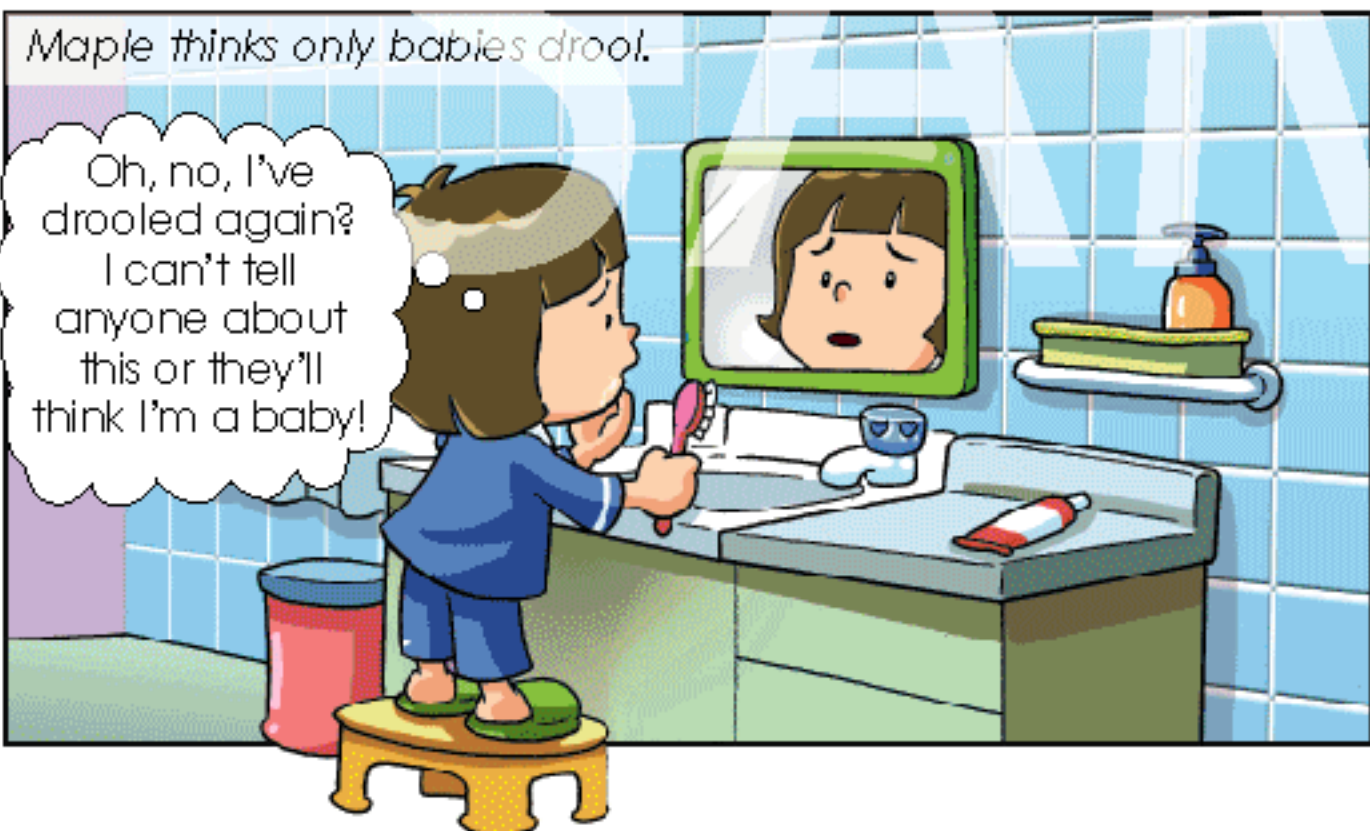
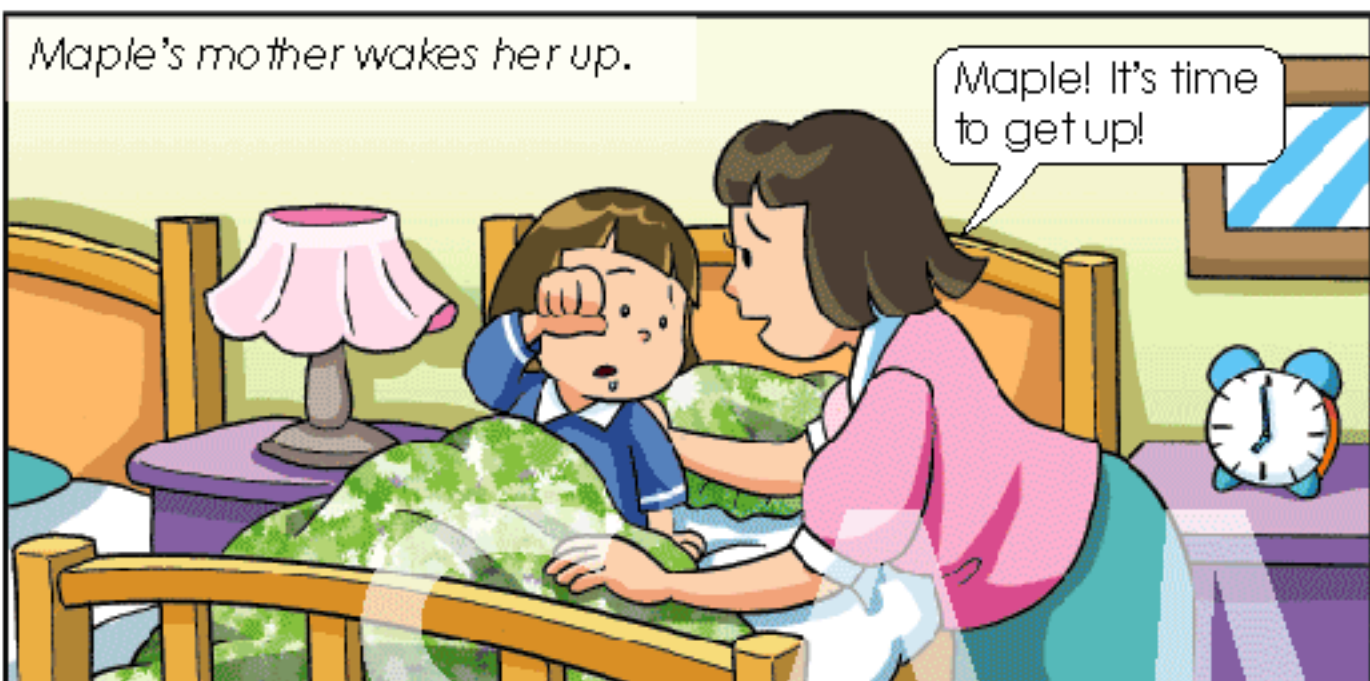
Poco says sorry to his mother.

## Where Has The Little Hedgehog Gone?



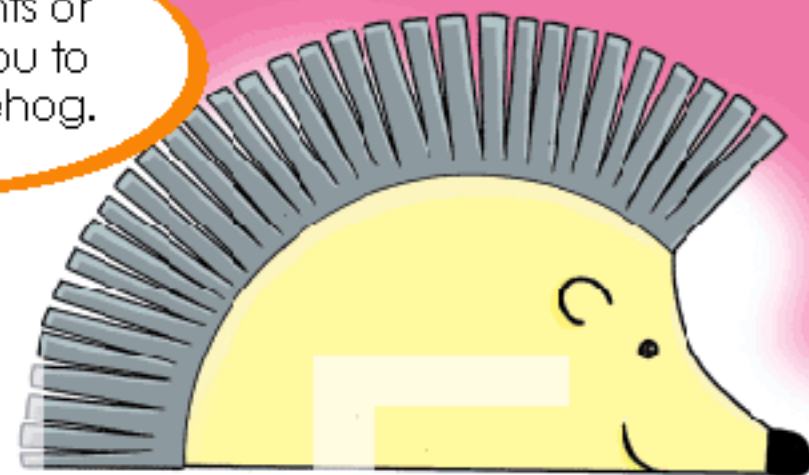

Make sure parents or teachers help you to make this hedgehog.

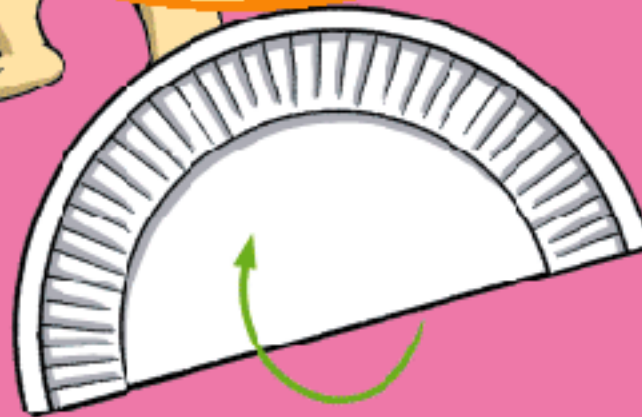


### TOOLS:
